SACRED: a Novel

The Story: Billionaire Trevor Scott is a desperate man who does not like to wait. He is desperately searching for his daughter who has been missing for several weeks... Trevor kidnaps Angie Gennaro and Patrick Kenzie, the detective duo, since they were not taking his calls or accepting any new cases. He tells them that he is dying and needs to see his daughter, Desiree, one last time... Angie and Patrick are intrigued and take the case. They forgot only one thing. Just like in most mystery novels, the client (Mr. Scott) does not tell the private investigators the truth. What follows is a roller coaster ride that sends Kenzie and Gennaro to a cult, a fraud scheme, and warped family values.

These two classic characters are witty and a joy to read. Lehane takes them out of their Boston neighborhood and sends them to sunny Florida... Once they find Desiree the reader learns that she has a lot of issues with Daddy. She will do whatever it takes to get even. This novel has a surprise ending in which all the villains get their just desserts when Patrick comes up with a devious plan.
